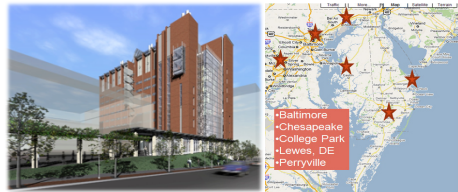

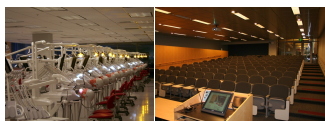
1. Introduction

We integrated Questionmark (QM) Perception electronic testing into the curriculum in 2006 to enhance the measurement of student performance and build test item bank for every course/program. This helped reduce faculty/staff time devoted to the preparation, administration, and grading of all the assessments as all aspects of testing is done electronically. All assessments are delivered via school issued laptop with secure browser. Students receive their grades along with feedback on the items they missed as soon as they finish submitting the assessment. Percentage grades are automatically loaded into the Blackboard's course grade book. Reports are generated for faculty to review and identify problematic test items for grade adjustments and improvement. More than 20 question types are available and may include multimedia and case-based questions. More than 200 assessments were delivered in Fall 2010 and because assessments are delivered electronically, "old assessments" don't end up in student test files. An added advantage going electronic is that we have been green and saving 180,000 sheets of paper and many printer cartridges.

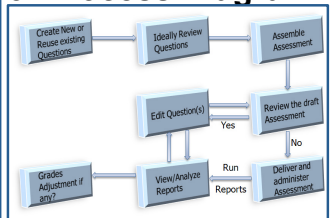

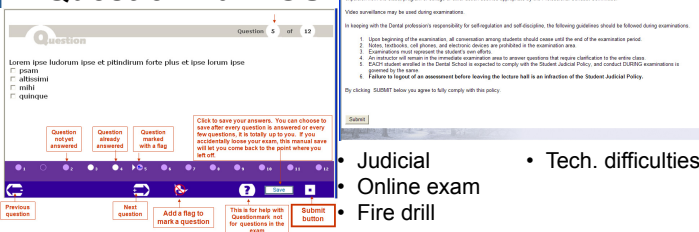

3. Process Diagram



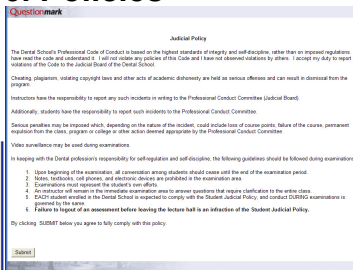
